

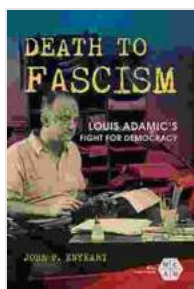
# Louis Adamic: A Champion of Democracy and the American Working Class
